Tree Limb Pickup

If there are storms that cause tree damage the Public Works department will pick up any downed limbs if they are put at the curb. They work their way through town as they have time to do so. If you are planning on doing your own yardwork and tree pruning, you can request that the city dump truck be brought to your house over the weekend. They will park it at the curb so that you can load it and they will haul it off on Monday. Call City Hall a few days in advance to arrange for this. Any work done by a hired individual or business has to be removed by the business, they cannot use city equipment or facilities. They also need to have a current business license with City of Duenweg. If you have any questions call City Hall at 417-623-2027.

Board of Aldermen....

The March 2017 Council Meeting was held on March 23, 2017 and the following were discussed:

- The Board of Aldermen discussed several topics for possible new water service projects, sewer projects, and areas that storm drainage needs to be addressed.
- The Board of Aldermen discussed and will soon be having the house at 202 Voegel torn down and the lot cleared.
- Bill NO 2017-001. An ordinance to fix a business license fee on any person/persons or company or corporation within the corporate limits of the City of Duenweg, Jasper County, Missouri was discussed and will be brought back to the next council meeting.
- The Board of Aldermen ratified the expenditure of the repair to the pump motor of Well #2.

Fire Department....

It is that time of year that everyone starts cleaning up debris on their properties.

We encourage everyone to make sure those items are picked up, but as you stack these items up please make sure you keep them away from your homes. Remember this is fuel that can burn and if stacked in bad spots and it did catch fire, it could also be detrimental to your home or other property so take the time to stack or put all items in the correct places to help prevent these things from happening. If you do decide that you want to burn your debris please contact the Duenweg Fire Department at 417-623-7408 between 7:30am and 4:30pm 7 days a week and let us know if you are planning on burning, this way we can let you know if it is a good time to burn or not. So far this year with the dry conditions and windy days so far it has not been a very good season to burn at this point. But if we give the ok we will tell you it is ok to burn and remember if you decide to burn and it gets out of control and damages other people's property you can be held liable for the cost of the damages. We will also notify dispatch if you will be burning so when people call they will not have us running to your place on every call unless it is you who call. Some things we need if you burn are your complete property address where you will be burning the debris and a phone number for you to be reached at when you call in about burning. Also remember that these are some of the things you need present if you burn: a rake, shovel, & water source with a hose long enough to reach your area you want to burn in.

To pay your water, sewer, trash bill with the City of Duenweg, PLEASE set it up for payment by the 14th of the month so it will clear and be posted to the CITY'S account before your bill is past due! We do NOT receive notifications that a payment has been made UNTIL that payment is DEPOSITED into OUR account, therefore, if you pay your bill using PayPal after the 13th of the month, we may not receive notice that you have paid that bill until after we have processed it for late payment! This does NOT affect payments made in person or over the phone using your debit or credit card.

The City of Duenweg Board of Aldermen (Council) meets on the FOURTH Thursday of the month at 7 p.m. If you would like to be listed on the agenda, please notify City Hall at (417) 623-2027 two business days before the meeting.

The City of Duenweg Park Board meets on the third Tuesday of the month at 7:00 p.m. If you would like to address the Park Board, please notify City Hall at (417) 623-2027 by the Monday before the meeting to be listed on the agenda.

The City of Duenweg Planning Board meets on the THIRD Thursday of the month at 7 p.m. If you would like to be listed on the agenda, please notify City Hall at (417) 623-2027 two business days before the meeting.

All Board Meetings are held in the Municipal Building at 118 Webb Street.

Past Due Notices City Water Bill Payments are Due Upon Receipt

Bills can be paid online through the City's web site and PayPal or in person at City Hall. Beginning on the 21st of each month, or on the Monday following that date if it falls on a weekend, a late charge of 10% is applied and past due notices are mailed out to those who have not paid their bills by that date. If the past due notices are not paid by the 25th of the same month at 8:00 am, then your water service will be discontinued on the 25th or the next business day if it is on a weekend or holiday. There is a reconnect fee if your water is turned off for non-payment.
