Fireworks can be discharged within the City of Duenweg between the hours of 9:00 am and 11:00 pm July 1-4 per Ordinance NO. 1349.

Tree Limb Pickup

If there are storms that cause tree damage the Public Works department will pick up any downed limbs if they are put at the curb. They work their way through town as they have time to do so. If you are planning on doing your own yardwork and tree pruning, you can request that the city dump truck be brought to your house over the weekend. They will park it at the curb so that you can load it and they will haul it off on Monday. Call City Hall a few

Any work done by a hired individual or business has to be removed by the business, they cannot use city equipment or facilities. They also need to have a current business license with City of Duenweg. If you have any questions call City Hall at 417-623-2027.

The June Council Meeting was held on June 23, 2016 and the following were on the agenda:

- Keri Bledsoe, 106 Azalea, storm water discussion. Mayor Olds is obtaining cooperation from the EPA to fix the issue.

- Bill NO 2016-001. An ordinance establishing certain fees and charges to establish or reestablish water service with the City of Duenweg, Jasper County, Missouri. Passed on the second and final reading.

Fire Department...

This upcoming fireworks season please take the time to be safe, know your surroundings, make sure your children are supervised at all times, and do not allow them to shoot of fireworks alone.

Please follow all of the Safety tips we have included and have a great 4th of July.

Firework Safety Tips

- The best way to protect your family is to not use any fireworks at home. Instead, attend public fireworks displays and leave the lighting to the professionals.
- If you plan to use fireworks, make sure they are legal in your area.
- Little arms are too short to hold sparklers, which can heat up to 1,200 degrees. How about this? Let your young children use glow sticks instead. They can be just as fun but they don't burn at a temperature hot enough to melt glass.
- Closely supervise children around fireworks at all times.
- Do not wear loose clothing while using fireworks.
- Never light fireworks indoors or near dry grass.
- Point fireworks away from homes, and keep away from brush, leaves and flammable substances
- Stand several feet away from lit fireworks. If a device does not go off, do not stand over it to investigate it. Put it out with water and dispose of it.
- Always have a bucket of water and/or a fire extinguisher nearby. Know how to operate the fire extinguisher properly.
- If a child is injured by fireworks, immediately go to a doctor or hospital. If an eye injury occurs, don't allow your child to touch or rub it, as this may cause even more damage.

The National Council on Fireworks Safety offers these common sense safety tips for using consumer fireworks in the hopes that injuries to consumers can be greatly reduced this season:

- Parents and caretakers should always closely supervise teens if they are using fireworks.
- Parents should not allow young children to handle or use fireworks.
- Fireworks should only be used outdoors.
- Always have water ready if you are shooting fireworks.
- Know your fireworks. Read the caution label before igniting.
- Obey local laws. If fireworks are not legal where you live, do not use them.
- Alcohol and fireworks do not mix.
- Wear safety glasses whenever using fireworks.
- Never relight a "dud" firework. Wait 20 minutes and then soak it in a bucket of water.
- Soak spent fireworks with water before placing them in an outdoor garbage can.
- Avoid using homemade fireworks or illegal explosives:
 They can kill you!
- Report illegal explosives, like M-80s and quarter sticks, to the fire or police department
- Always remain standing while using sparklers.
- Never hold a child in your arms while using sparklers.
- Never hold, or light, more than one sparkler at a time.
- Never throw sparklers.
- Sparkler wire and stick remain hot long after the flame has gone out. Be sure to drop spent sparklers in a bucket of water.
- Teach children not to wave sparklers, or run, while holding sparklers.

To pay your water, sewer, trash bill with the City of Duenweg, PLEASE set it up for payment by the 14th of the month so it will clear and be posted to the CITY'S account before your bill is past due! We do NOT receive notifications that a payment has been made UNTIL that payment is DEPOSITED into OUR account, therefore, if you pay your bill using PayPal after the 13th of the month, we may not receive notice that you have paid that bill until after we have processed it for late payment! This does NOT affect payments made in person or over the phone using your debit or credit card.

The City of Duenweg Park Board meets on the second Monday of the month at 7:00 p.m. If you would like to address the Park Board, please notify City Hall at (417) 623-2027 by the Monday before the meeting to be listed on the agenda.

The City of Duenweg Planning Board meets on the THIRD Thursday of the month at 7 p.m. If you would like to be listed on the agenda, please notify City Hall at (417) 623-2027 two business days before the meeting.

All Board Meetings are held in the Municipal Building at 118 Webb Street.

Past Due Notices City Water Bill Payments are Due Upon Receipt

Bills can be paid online through the City's web site and PayPal or in person at City Hall.

Beginning on the 21st of each month, or on the Monday following that date if it falls on a weekend, a late charge of 10% is applied and past due notices are mailed out to those who have not paid their bills by that date. If the past due notices are not paid by the last day of the month, then your water service will be discontinued on the date indicated on your water bill at 8 a.m. There is a reconnect fee if your water is turned off for non-payment.
